## Yard Waste Collection

Yard Waste Collection is underway and continues until the end of October, weather permitting.



Yard waste in clear plastic bags and branches tied in bundles 1.0 metre in length can be set out on the same day as blue recycle bin pickup. A maximum of 6 bags or bundles of branches will be collected at one time. Please be patient as it can take **2 FULL DAYS** to collect yard waste in each area.

Residents with large amounts of yard waste can take the material to the landfill **FREE OF CHARGE!**

## Weekly Garbage Collection



Weekly garbage collection started at the beginning of June.

Residents are asked to check their garbage schedules for pick up dates. Schedules are available on the City website at <http://www.citypa.ca> or through the Public Works Dept., 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, City Hall or by calling 953-4900.

## Residential Street Sweeping

Residential street sweeping has begun and will proceed in the following rotation unless garbage collection is occurring in that area:



1. West Flat/Westview
2. West Hill
3. East Hill
4. Crescent Heights/Crescent Acres/Carlton Park
5. East Flat/Riverview
6. Midtown
7. Nordale/Hazeldell/North Industrial

Four units will run for ten hours per day, five days per week, weather permitting. It is expected that the sweeping will be concluded within 6 to 7 weeks unless weather conditions create significant delays. Major roadways in the City have already been completed.

**Residential areas are signed "No Parking" the day before sweeping occurs. Residents can help City crews by ensuring that parked vehicles are moved from signed areas. The removal of parked vehicles will allow crews to thoroughly clean all areas of the street.**

## Street Oiling

The Street Oiling Program and lane grading will get underway starting the week of June 15<sup>th</sup> 2009, weather permitting. Street oiling will begin in the West Flat area of the City, moving to the East Flat, then Hazeldell and Nordale.

"No Parking" signs will be posted on the streets the day before oiling occurs. Residents are asked to ensure vehicles are moved off of the street to accommodate city equipment and proper street oiling.
