## FREE SKATEBOARD & BMX LESSONS FOR BEGINNERS

Ages: 6-13 years Dates: Every Wed. July 7 - Aug 11 Time: 12:00 - 2:00 pm

(Skateboard and BMX lessons will run alongside each other)

### BMX Lessons

Children and youth just beginning to ride a BMX bike at the skatepark are encouraged to register for FREE BMX lessons. Class instruction includes beginner and intermediate BMX/Freestyle skills such as dropping in, jumps, gaps, grinds and park etiquette. Required equipment: BMX/Freestyle bike, helmet and water. Knee and elbow pads are also recommended.

### Skateboard Lessons

Children and youth will learn the basics of skateboarding including park etiquette, safety, balance, and elementary tricks. Learn proper foot placement, pushing, riding, turning, safe approaches to ramps as well as an introduction to an "ollie" and "dropping in". Required equipment: Skateboard, helmet and water. Knee and elbow pads are also recommended.

## *Boat Operator Accredited Training (B.O.A.T.) "Get Carded - It's the Law"*

As of September 2009 any person who operates a pleasure craft in Canada, regardless of age or experience requires a Coast Guard approved. Pleasure Craft Operator Card. PCO Cards are issued by accredited agencies to individuals who achieve a passing score (75%) on a proctored written exam. The Lifesaving Society's B.O.A.T. course prepares individuals to write the exam by exploring the fundamentals of safe boating in a classroom setting. Topics include: required safety equipment, loading limits, buoys, beacons, signs, weather and fueling procedures. The instructor will administer the exam and issue PCO cards to those who achieve a passing score at the end of the course.

The course is perfect to take as a family. This is a lifetime certification – no recertification or refresh course ever required. AJF Gold members are eligible for a 10% discount. PCO Cards are issued same day – no waiting required. Individuals who fail the exam can re-write during one of the other scheduled courses for a fee of \$15.00
