Cat Crisis at the SPCA Continues

No adoption fees until December 31/10

The SPCA would like to inform local residents that the cat crisis at the SPCA continues. “Cats are being brought in on a daily basis,” said Debbie Lehner, Manager of the SPCA. “We have accepted several mother cats with kittens and unfortunately last week, we turned away several cats that were brought to as strays due to the lack of space.” **We would ask the public to please call the SPCA prior to bringing in stray cats to see if there is space available.**

We have one week to place approximately 15 healthy, adoptable cats into families. If the SPCA cannot find homes for these beautiful pets, sadly they will be euthanized.

The SPCA wants to remind residents that there remains a need for families and individuals to come out and adopt a cat. “The facility is currently housing approximately 50 cats plus we have an additional 10 cats placed in foster homes,” said Lehner. “We encourage the public to come out and take advantage of our “no adoption fee”. Now is as good a time as ever to adopt a cat.”

The SPCA would like to take this opportunity to thank the citizens of Prince Albert and area for their support in this time of crisis.
