Water Crane Temporarily Closed

Alternative locations identified

The City of Prince Albert would like to advise residents that the coin-activated Bulk Water Dispenser (commonly referred to as the Water Crane) located in the lane between Exhibition Drive and 8th Avenue East (adjacent to the City Yards) has been temporarily closed. This facility typically supplies bulk haulers, rural residents, and out-of-town farmers in the vicinity of Prince Albert with a means to fill portable tanks or trucks.

Patrons of the City's water crane that require a fill-up source during the closure period are encouraged to contact other water service providers in the region. The following water service providers are equipped with bulk potable water dispensers:

- Town of Birch Hills (306-749-2232)
- Village of Saint Louis (306-422-8471)
- Town of Shellbrook (306-747-3510)
- Town of Nipawin (1-877-647-2946)

Addresses of the alternative locations and additional notes are provided below. Please note that all information has been provided by 3rd party sources, and thus the City of Prince Albert assumes no responsibility for its accuracy or completeness. It is recommended that customers unfamiliar with alternative sites contact the listed operator to verify key details, to ask questions, or obtain more information.

Birch Hills -- #30 Wilson Street. Certain restrictions may apply due to pump size and availability of supply.

St. Louis: -- #538 Riverside Drive (in front of the Water Treatment Plant). Dispenser accepts quarters, loonies, and toonies.

Shellbrook: #619 2nd Ave. E. Dispenser accepts loonies and toonies.

Nipawin: -- Nipawin Road West and Timber Drive (East of the RCMP building, which is to the West). Dispenser accepts loonies. Water rate is \$1.00 per 25 gallons.
