



2026 Community Grant Accessible Swim Program Criteria

The City of Prince Albert is now accepting submissions from non-profit organizations for funding from the Saskatchewan Lotteries Community Grant Program for the 2026 Accessible Swim Program at the Kinsmen Water Park.

Deadline for submissions is April 15th, 2026.

Criteria

Organizations will apply for funding by April 15th

- The Organizations who applied will receive a phone call to confirm approval or denial by May 15th
- The pass is deemed active opening day of the Kinsmen Water Park.
- In the event passes remain unpaid by June 1st, the Sport & Recreation Manager reserves the right to cancel the pass and return the funds to the Community Grant Accessible Swim Program.
- An organization may be limited to only one grant with the maximum amount of funding that can be applied for being \$5,000.

Applications can be submitted for the following Kinsmen Water Park passes only:

- Youth Pass
- Adult Pass
- Group Pass (Maximum 2 adults and 4 children)

Above passes are valid for 1 entry each.

- Individual Youth Bulk Pass (10)
- Group Bulk Pass (10)

Bulk Passes can be used throughout the 2026 Kinsmen Water Park season.

The Application will be approved if:

- There are no current passes or swimming lessons valid on the personal or family account of the potential bulk pass holder; and the personal or family account of the potential bulk pass holder is in good standing with the City of Prince Albert.
- Participants are expected to follow all current facility rules and policies.
- Organizations include all relevant contact information for families and/or individuals requesting a bulk pass and ensure their online account is created.
- Passes cannot be exchanged for any monetary amount.
- Once the Application is received it will be reviewed by the Sport & Recreation Manager and Aquatic Coordinator, based on criteria set out in the Community Grant Accessible Swim Program, the application will be approved or denied.
- The Sport & Recreation Manager reserves the right to question any application.
- Upon special application, the Sport & Recreation Manager may approve or deny financial assistance to community groups with Community Grant Accessible Swim Program Policy Funding.

Once applications are approved, the City of Prince Albert will invoice the Organization who will pay for the passes they were approved for. This follows the Community Grant Policy where Organizations then submit a follow up with proof of payment followed by the Organization receiving the funding they were approved for.
