The Margo Fournier Arts Centre (formerly the Prince Albert Arts Centre) is operated by the City of Prince Albert and serves as a vibrant hub for arts, culture, and community programming. Located in the heart of the downtown cultural district at 1010 Central Avenue, the Centre is housed in the historic former Town Hall and Opera House—completed in 1893 and designated a National Historic Site.

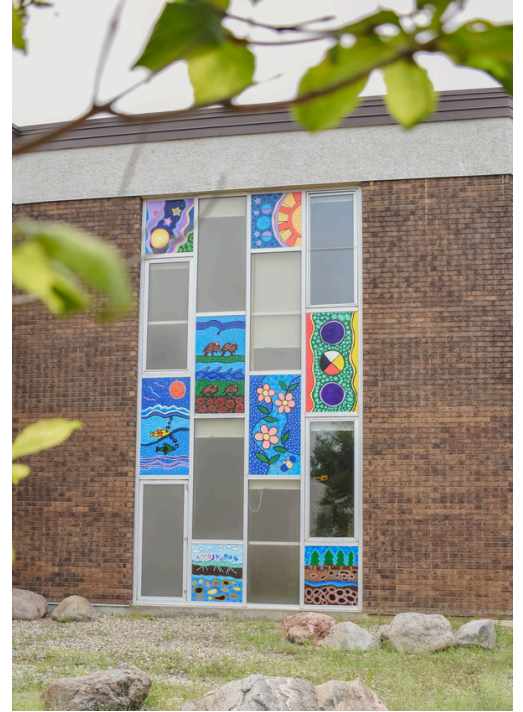

1 PUBLIC ART STIMULUS FUND

The Public Art Partnership Stimulus grant provides funds in support of one or two project(s) per year that can assist a professional artist, Prince Albert professional arts organizations, non-profit organization, municipality, school division, or private business, partnering with a professional artist, to complete a public art project. Grants will be up to a maximum of \$7,500 per applicant per year.

The Public Art Stimulus Fund application can be made at any time throughout the year. Funds are limited so plan ahead.

The Mann is Prince Albert's only public art gallery and the northernmost public art gallery in Saskatchewan. It thus has an important role to play in promoting local and regional artists' work through mounting and touring exhibitions, producing catalogues, and conducting curatorial visits.

The Mann's Arts Education Program offers exhibition tours, drop-in art activities, professional development opportunities, and more. They operate with the belief that all individuals can enjoy and learn from visual art, regardless of age, ability, mobility, and financial situation.

We read and act out the story, "The Museum", by Susan Verde, about a child experiencing a variety of feelings while visiting an art museum. Includes over 60 props with 2 interactive games.

The Prince Albert Arts Board champions a vibrant, inclusive arts community by advocating for artists and arts organizations, stewarding the City's Civic Arts Policy, and collaborating closely with the City of Prince Albert to support its implementation. Through active engagement with artists and organizations, the Board works to understand local needs, generate and share resources, promote Prince Albert's arts scene locally and beyond, and expand opportunities for participation and recognition—particularly for Indigenous and youth artists—helping ensure the arts continue to thrive and enrich community life.

1 HELEN FERRIS MEMORIAL FUND GRANT

This grant provides a student between the ages of 5 and 30 the opportunity to further develop their artistic practice in the areas of visual arts, creative arts, media arts, music, drama, dance, and literature.

Grant amount is a maximum of \$800.

There are two submission deadlines annually:

May 31 and September 30.

To qualify:

1. An applicant must be between the ages of 5 and 30 years.
2. An applicant must be a current student at an elementary, secondary, or post-secondary school in Prince Albert or immediate area.
3. An applicant must reside within Prince Albert or immediate area. The parent or legal guardian residence determines eligibility.

There are typically three deadlines a year in Spring (for summer programs), August (for Fall programs) and December (for January – June programs).

SK Arts provides funding and support to the arts for the benefit of all people in Saskatchewan.

1 ARTISTS IN SCHOOLS GRANTS

Partners professional artists with schools to enrich arts learning and support educational outcomes by boosting student engagement, cross-disciplinary skills, and lifelong interest in the arts.

The program includes a **Development** grant (max \$2,000) for early planning and relationship-building, a **Projects** grant (max. \$10,000-\$20,000) that support co-created, inquiry-based arts learning tailored to school communities, and a **Residencies** grant (max \$8,000) that enable Saskatchewan K-12 schools to host artists in full-time, one-to-five-month placements embedded in the school environment.

Deadlines for all 3 streams are April 5 and November 5 each year.

2 LIVE ARTS SASKATCHEWAN

LIVE (Live Interactive Video Education) Arts is a dynamic distance education arts program for students in grades 1 to 9.

The program supports the Saskatchewan Arts Education Curriculum and is delivered via the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education LIVE Network (CommunityNet). **There is no charge to participate.**

Teachers sign up for grade-specific programs then professional artists connect simultaneously with teachers and students in multiple schools across the province for a LIVE experience with arts education, including visual arts, drama, music, and dance.
