- **All participants must wear a CSA approved helmet. Other equipment is not mandatory but shin pads, hockey gloves and cup are recommended**
- **Participants must bring their own pucks**
- **Participants must be able to skate unassisted**
- **Participants must receive a wristband from the front desk once they have paid to show the ice supervisor once they arrive at the dressing room.**

PUBLIC SKATING RULES

City of Prince Albert

It is the responsibility of staff to provide a safe & enjoyable skating environment for members of the public. In order to achieve this environment, the following guidelines are to be followed:

1. The centre of the ice is reserved for beginner skaters and assistants. Please exercise extra caution around this area.
2. Skate at a moderate, safe speed in a forward direction. No skating backwards unless assisting a beginner skater in the centre of the ice.
3. Tag or games are not permitted. Those displaying unacceptable behaviour that will endanger the safety and/or enjoyment of others on or off the ice will be asked to leave.
4. No food or beverage is allowed on the ice or in player benches during public skating sessions. Only sealed water bottles are permitted.
5. Skaters should not loiter along the arena boards or in areas that may block the traffic flow. Sitting on the boards is also not permitted.
6. CSA approved helmets are strongly recommended for all participants during public skating and in particular for children and youth
7. Figure skating routines, hockey sticks, pucks and ringette rings are not permitted.
8. No headsets, cell phones or hand held electronic devices are to be used while skating.
9. Carrying an infant on the ice, regardless of helmet or safety attire, is not allowed due to the risk of injury to both the child and guardian.
10. Outdoor footwear is permitted on the ice only for those people assisting beginner skaters. All participants on the ice MUST have on a pair of ice cleats, which are available from the on-ice supervisors and must be returned at the end of the session. All outer footwear must be clean and free of debris to avoid it tracking onto the ice surface.
11. Personal skating assists or skate aids are not allowed. Only City of Prince Albert issued skate aids are allowed, where available.
12. Wheelchairs or sledges are allowed for people with disabilities. If an attendant is necessary, he or she must be wearing skates and be a skilled skater, or wear ice cleats.
13. No entry on the ice while ice resurfacer is being operated. Please wait until the gates are closed before using the ice.
14. The City of Prince Albert will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.
15. The City of Prince Albert values the safety and security of visitors and staff. Inappropriate, abusive, undesirable, dangerous or criminal behaviour will not be tolerated.
16. Anyone under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be refused entry or removed from the premise.
17. **Emergency Procedures**
ONE LONG WHISTLE: EMERGENCY – Stop all activity, clear the ice surface, exit to the front lobby.
TWO SHORT WHISTLES: Look to arena staff for direction.

To ensure a safe & friendly environment for skaters, the City of Prince Albert asks that you observe the above rules. Anyone breaking these rules could be issued a warning or be asked to leave the facility.
