RE: Notice of Construction – 16 & 17 Street West (1 – 2 Avenue)

The City of Prince Albert Public Works Department would like to advise businesses and residents of upcoming roadway rehabilitation work on **16 & 17 Street West between 1st and 2nd Avenue**) The project includes asphalt milling, paving, and select concrete repairs. Please refer to the attached map for the project limits.

Project Schedule: August 10 to August 22, 2026 (*weather permitting*)

Impacted Area: Construction activities will occur within the area outlined in **orange** on the attached map.

Phase 1 – Asphalt Milling (Beginning, Monday, August 10th)

During this phase, access to the project area will remain available; however, motorists are asked to limit vehicle movements where possible to facilitate construction activities.

- “No Parking” signs will be installed one day before milling operations begin.

Phase 2 – Concrete Work

During this phase, access to the project site remains available; however, on-street parking will not be permitted adjacent to active concrete work. Please do not park beside pink spray paint markings or where “No Parking” signs have been installed.

Phase 3 – Asphalt Paving

Paving will occur in two stages:

Bottom Lift: There will be approximately two days of bottom lift paving on 16th and 17th Street West. During this time vehicle access will remain available; however, short delays may occur while the contractor facilitates access.

Top Lift: The final asphalt lift is tentatively scheduled for **Saturday, August 22nd** (*weather permitting*).

- The roadway will be closed for approximately 24 hours.
- **No vehicle access will be permitted during this closure.**
- Do not drive on the new asphalt until road closures have been removed.

Parking & Access

To minimize the impact on businesses, the City has scheduled the final paving on **Saturday, August 22nd** (*weather permitting*), when most businesses in the area are closed. We recognize that several businesses operate seven days a week and will be affected by the temporary closure. Because the asphalt must be placed continuously across the full roadway width, vehicle access cannot be maintained during the final paving operation. Businesses, customers, employees, suppliers, and service providers are encouraged to plan accordingly.

Fresh Asphalt

Motorists are asked not to drive on freshly paved asphalt or tack oil. Fresh asphalt and tack oil can adhere to vehicle tires and damage the new roadway surface. Please wait until road closures have been removed before accessing the roadway.



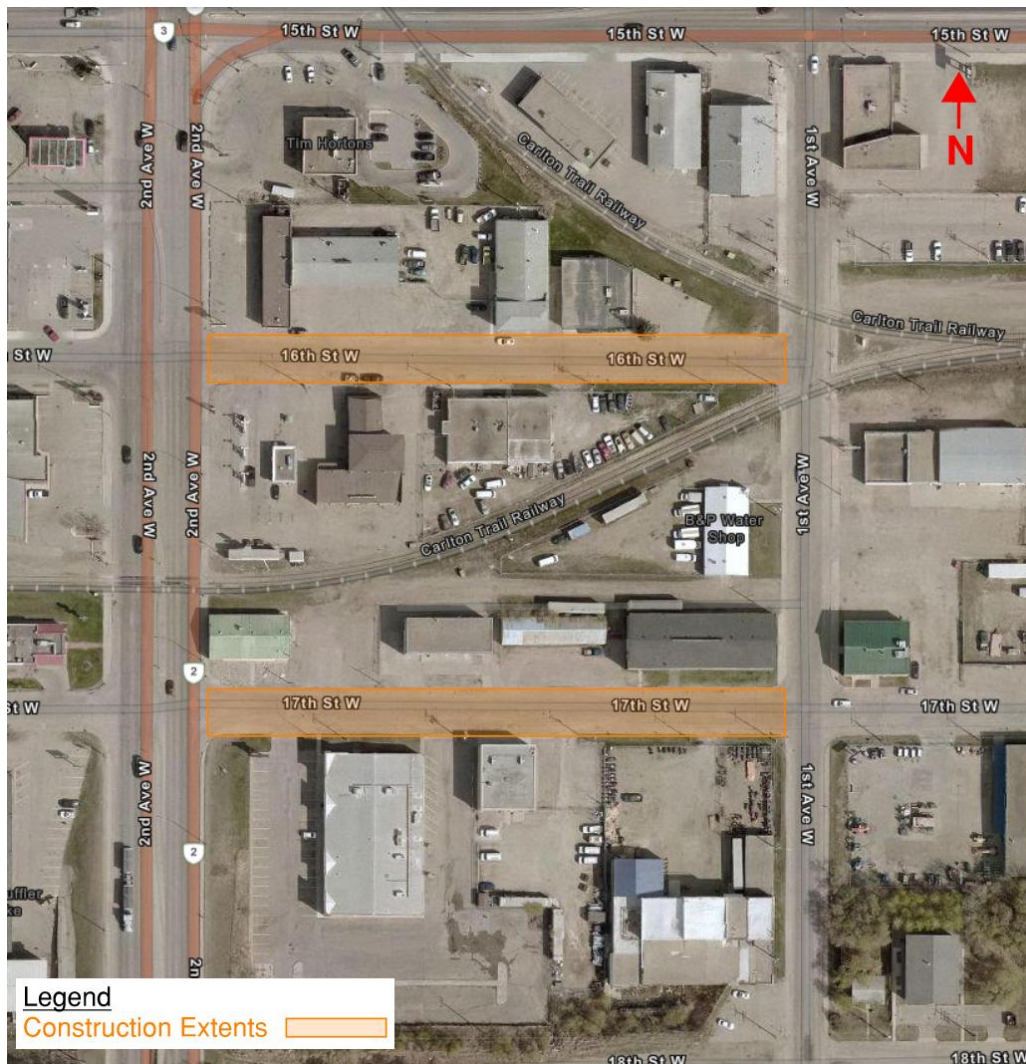
